Brian J. Lepore is a Director of Defense Capabilities and Management at the U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO) in Washington, D.C. He directs audit teams reviewing the Department of Defense's infrastructure programs including base realignment and closure (BRAC); facilities sustainment, modernization, and restoration; base operations; alternative financing of infrastructure programs; military construction; and facilities energy management. Mr. Lepore co-led GAO's Recovery Colorado team reviewing American Recovery and Reinvestment Act grant spending by the State of Colorado. Mr. Lepore was previously detailed to the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee's investigation into the government's response to Hurricane Katrina. Before that, as Assistant Director or Analyst-in-Charge Mr. Lepore led reviews of the homeland air defense system, intelligence information sharing, military readiness in Korea, plans to reduce the impact of the U.S. military presence on Okinawa, the use of unmanned aircraft systems, aerial refueling aircraft requirements, chemical and biological warfare defense, general and flag officer requirements, and physical performance standards in the military. Prior to assignment to headquarters, Mr. Lepore served in GAO's former Far East Office in Honolulu, Hawaii and his reviews included the adequacy of controls over security assistance to Thailand and the Philippines, certain bilateral trade with Japan, procedures for disposal of excess property at the former Subic Bay Naval Station in the Philippines, U.S. participation in the World Food Program in India and Pakistan, humanitarian aid to children and victims of war in Cambodia, and U.S. military readiness in Japan and Korea.

Prior to his federal career, Mr. Lepore was a radio news and sports broadcaster at several radio stations in Massachusetts.

Mr. Lepore has received numerous GAO awards including the Client Service Award in 2014 for reviews of the defense support infrastructure enterprise, a Distinguished Service Award for reviewing the 2005 round of BRAC in 2012, Results Through Teamwork Award for reviewing implementation of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act in 2009, the Comptroller General's Integrity Award in 2003 for reviewing Air Force aerial refueling aircraft recapitalization plans, the Defense Capabilities and Management Leadership Award in 2003, the Comptroller General's Meritorious Service Award for reviews of military operations and capabilities in 1996, and the Assistant Comptroller General's award for exceptional performance in evaluating military readiness issues in Korea and Okinawa in 1998.

Mr. Lepore holds a Master in Public Administration degree from Suffolk University in Boston, Massachusetts and a Bachelor of Arts in Communications Studies from the University of Massachusetts in Amherst.
