

In this half-day program, participants will first examine the strategic implications of AI before putting those insights to work in a focused oral briefing practicum that mirrors the demands of real-world decisionmaking.

Learn the ins and outs of Washington's unique political landscape from D.C. insiders and experienced policy practitioners. Understand how formal institutions and informal networks interact to advance policy interests. Sharpen the skills you need to manage crises, assess breaking developments, and engage both government and nongovernment actors.

Meeting China's Military Challenge

Engage with today's most pressing defense challenges in this two-day course about the implications of China's military rise and its impact on U.S. national security. Expert-led seminars and an immersive wargame will illuminate the consequences of a U.S.-China conflict and the effectiveness of U.S. force structure and strategy.

Inside DOD's FY27 Budget

Gain access to expert analysis on major changes in the U.S. FY 2027 defense budget request and the Trump administration's national defense strategy. Dive deep into how these changes will affect the defense enterprise and how to find the data that's most important for your organization.

Global Foresight: Preparing for Future Trends

Explore the critical megatrends that will shape the world over the next 30 years and unpack important policy issues and trends alongside top CSIS scholars and foresight practitioners. Develop strategic foresight tools—from identifying drivers of change to building future worlds—and learn to anticipate external challenges.
