The U.S.-Canadian energy relationship is key to both countries. Canada is the leading supplier of energy to the United States. Canada sends almost 100 percent of its crude oil and natural gas exports to the United States, totaling over 2 million barrels a day of crude oil. Natural gas exports from Canada account for 16 percent of U.S. natural gas consumption.

As part of our continuing effort to promote energy cooperation between Canada and the United States, the CSIS Energy Program and the Canada Project will co-host a meeting featuring representatives from Canada's energy producing provinces to discuss recent developments in the Canadian energy industry and the prospect of broader collaboration with the United States.
