With the ten-year anniversary of the Dayton Peace accords approaching on November 21<sup>st</sup>, USIP and CSIS joint host an event to discuss whether complimentary models of transitional justice, with courts at a national and international level, provide the most effective means of prosecuting war crimes while bringing stability and security to a country post conflict. Sharing their experience will be a delegation from the Ministry of Justice and Special War Crimes Chamber from Bosnia Herzegovina. Working alongside the ICTY, the Court has just recently started to handle trials, the first indictees having been transferred in September 2005, including 10 suspects involved in the murders of 1000 men and boys in Srebrenica.
