

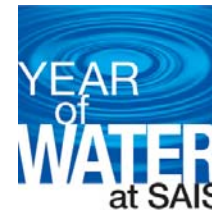


Freedom in Creation

*The Primacy of Water Development:
Sustainability through Community*

Community ownership of water resources defines management for long-term sustainability. **Freedom in Creation**, a community led arts-based psychosocial, education, and water development program in war-affected Northern Uganda, has developed a unique model for water development whereby children are enabled to help bring fresh water to their community. This establishes community ownership and sustainability as the children, known to abuse wells, instead protect them.
