Peggy Liu

Chairperson, JUCCCE

Peggy Liu is Chairperson of JUCCCE. She was honored as a Time Magazine 2008 Environmental Hero and a World Economic Forum Young Global Leader 2009. Peggy was an adviser to the Clinton Global Initiative 2008 on Energy & Climate Change. Most recently, Peggy was COO of Mustang Ventures, an early-stage venture capital fund in Shanghai, China. Peggy, an active alumna of MIT, organized the MIT Forum on the Future of Energy in China 2007 from which JUCCCE was formed. In the 1990's Peggy was on the cover of "Red Herring Hits" as an Internet pioneer in Silicon Valley. She was General Manager of Consumer Applications at Zaplet, a dynamic email communications platform (funded by KPCB and acquired by MetricStream). She was also VP of Marketing at SeeUthere.com (now owned by Starcite). As an independent advisor, she consulted ecommerce companies on strategy, fundraising, and business partnerships. In 1996, Peggy co-founded and was CEO of Channel A, one of the earliest business-to-consumer ecommerce web sites. She led NetManage into the retail channel with Internet Chameleon, the first consumer software package to connect Windows users to the Internet. As Product Manager at Symantec, she managed the Macintosh development tools line, helped launch Symantec C++ for Windows, and built the OEM channel for Symantec's Norton Group. Peggy was also a management consultant at McKinsey & Co. Peggy is Chinese-American and resides in Shanghai. She has a B.S. from MIT in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science. She has been in non-profit leadership positions for most of her life and has a passion for making the world a better place.

Steve Papermaster

Steve Papermaster is an experienced entrepreneur and investor in the private sector as well as an active leader in a number of key public sector roles. As Chairman of Powershift Ventures L.P., an Austin, Texas, USA based venture capital firm, Mr. Papermaster focuses on investments in technology companies, including software and internet, bio and nanotech, and clean energy. Mr. Papermaster has also provided innovative, constructive leadership to several public sector initiatives which impact United States and international policies for science, technology, and economic development. Primary among these is Mr. Papermaster's role on the President's Council of Advisors on Science and Technology (PCAST), which he was appointed to by President George W. Bush in 2001. His present and past entrepreneurial experiences include serving as Chairman, CEO and/or board member for several public and private companies. In addition to his PCAST initiatives, Mr. Papermaster serves as chairman of Technology Network Texas (TechNet), as well as being a member of TechNet's National Executive Committee. Mr. Papermaster is a past recipient of the Ernst & Young Entrepreneur of the Year Award, and has served as a national judge and represented the United States as the judge for the World Entrepreneur of the Year awards. He is active as a community leader with organizations such as the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation, Innovation Alliance, and 360 Summits.
