DOMESTIC THREATS

UNFIXED DOMESTIC FACTORS

- Same rotating elites.
- Disgruntled masses, prone to anti-elite populist rhetoric.
- Lack of political parties.
- Active civil society.
- Judicial system where crime pays.
- Oligarchs.
- Lower economic growth than potential.
- Small middle class.
- Large shadow economy.
- Trade still more tied to the east than to west.

PUBLIC SUPPORT FOR REFORMS

- 'Reforms' has many meanings:
- 1. Economic.
- 2. Financial.
- 3. Energy.
- 4. Oligarchs.
- 5. Corruption.
- 4 and 5 have public support but support for 1-3 is more limited.



CORRUPTION AND LAW ENFORCEMENT


- Prosecutor-General's office:
- 1. Incompetent in defending the rule of law.
- 2. Competent in protecting elites.
- 3. Neo-Soviet institution.
- 4. Over-manned.
- 5. Highly corrupt.
- Security Service of Ukraine (SBU).
- Ministry of Interior.
- Judicial system.



OLIGARCHS AND THE WEST

- Western position on 'taming' oligarchs contradictory and no clear message:
- 1. Re-nationalization of assets?
- 2. Remove their control over large television channels?
- 3. Prosecute and Imprison them?
- Oligarch can steal only because they have a place to deposit ill gotten gains:
- 1. Cyprus, London, Austria, France, Switzerland, Lichtenstein, Monaco.
- 2. Virgin Islands, Panama, Belize.

POROSHENKO, KLITSCHKO AND THE GAS LOBBY



- Lyovochkin resigns (Jan.14).
- Gas lobby leaders negotiate their names off Ukraine Interpol wanted list (February-March 2014).
- Lyovochkin brokers deal in Vienna with Firtash, Poroshenko and Klitschko (March 2014).
- Firtash buys and is protected by Viennese elites (March-April 2014).
- Poroshenko and Klitschko elected (May 2014).
- Boyko-Lyovochkin elected as leaders of Opposition Bloc (Oct.14).

EXTERNAL THREATS

PUTIN AND RUSSIA

UKRAINE'S GEOPOLITICAL NO MANS LAND

- Since 2014, large scale change in attitudes to Russia have made Ukrainians more pro-EU and NATO.
- But, Western Europeans remain opposed to NATO and EU enlargement for Ukraine (and Georgia). <u>Ukraine remains in a geopolitical no man's land:</u>
- 1. Cannot go to Russia because of public opinion and because Russia offers only semi-colonial status and a country run by a Ukrainian "Kadyrov".
- 2. Cannot integrate into EU and NATO because of low support in Western Europe and weak political will on implementing 'reforms'.

EU GIVES UKRAINE AN IMPOSSIBLE TASK

- 1. Inherited worse legacy from USSR than Central-Eastern Europe.
- 2. Received far smaller funding from EU for reforms.
- 3. EU and influential EU members do not support enlargement to Ukraine.
- 4. Eastern Partnership's EU is enlargement-lite or enlargement substitute.
- 5. Ukraine expected to introduce huge proportion of Copenhagen Criteria with worse legacy, smaller funding, and no membership carrot.

PUTIN'S OBJECTIVES IN UKRAINE

- Since 2007-2008, turn to extreme nationalism and anti-Western xenophobia.
- Reliance on White émigré nationalist and fascists (Ivan Ilyin) and domestic formerly marginal nationalists (Aleksandr Dugin).
- Putin: Ukrainians and Russians are one people.
- Ukraine should live within the Russian World.
- Ukrainians who seek to join EU or NATO are 'fascists'.
- Regime change to install a Ukrainian 'Kadyrov.'
- Ukraine to resemble a weak federalized Bosnia.

PUTIN FACES REALITY IN UKRAINE

- New Russia project failed because:
- 1. Ukraine's Russian speakers are not 'Russians' and especially not pro-Putin.
- 2. 'New Russia's 8 regions are very different and separatism had support only in the Crimea and Donbas.
- 3. Kharkiv and Odesa were swing regions.
- 4. Pro-Putin Russian speakers have a Soviet/eastern Slavic identity, view Russia as a higher civilization to Europe & see Ukraine as part of the Russkii Mir.
- 5. Large numbers of Russian speakers joined Ukrainian volunteer battalions or were conscripted and work in civil society support groups.

PUTIN'S 'ACHIEVEMENTS'

- Annexed the Crimea creating a frozen conflict.
- Donbas failed, requiring Russian invasion (August 2014) and greater military support.
- 40,000 separatist forces larger than many NATO members.
- Putin is the most negatively viewed foreign leader.
- Support for CIS integration at record low.
- Support for NATO membership over 50%.
- Support for EU membership over 60%.
- Pro-Russian political camp disintegrated.
- Russia expected to be let off hook as in Georgia in 2008 but Western sanctions tougher than anticipated.

DONBAS

- Not a civil war: far more Russian speakers back Kyiv than separatists.
- Not a frozen conflict:
- Central governments in Moldova, Georgia, Azerbaijan defeated by Russian-backed separatists.
- 2. Ukraine government not defeated so unresolved conflict.
- 3. Stalemate with neither side achieving goals.
- Will the Donbas be reintegrated on Russian terms?
- Is Syria a temporary distraction?



WEAK WESTERN LEADERS

- EU sanctions only tougher after MH17 shot down.
- France-Germany at Minsk 1, 2 and Normandy talks seek to 'resolve' the 'Ukrainian problem' as quickly as possible, giving in to Putin's demands.
- West hopes to muddle through, appealing to worst instincts of Ukrainian elites and assists Putin's agenda.
- President Obama: unwilling to send military equipment and providing meager economic assistance.
- Obama passes buck to Western Europeans.
- PM Harper and Canadian parliament: all rhetoric, no substance. Western governments unwilling take responsibility and delegate to international financial institutions.
- Military training by UK, Poland, Israel, Georgia, Canada, US, Turkey.
- But, how different to NATO PfP training since 1994?

IS RECONCILIATION POSSIBLE?

- Ukraine problem will remain as long as Putin and his allies are in power.
- Putin is not intending to give up power.
- Therefore Ukrainian question will remain on table as long as Putin is Russian president.
- Putin will continue to seek to undermine the EU (e.g. supporting anti-EU nationalists, populists & fascists).
- Russian speakers in Latvia and Estonia: hybrid war opportunity to undermine NATO article 5.
- How can West withdraw sanctions without sending signal annexation of territory is not punishable?
- Situation will remain unstable because Putin's strategic agenda incomplete, meaning future crises likely.
