Elected government assumes office

- On 06 Jun, estimated crude oil export revenue was \$7.4 billion for 2004
- In Jan, the Iraq Ministry of Planning reported a national unemployment rate of 28 percent and underemployment rate of 21.6 percent
- Iraq's annualized inflation rate for Apr was 19.6%, down from its peak of 47.7% in Oct 03
  - Over past six months the CPI has risen by 3.5%, or 7.0% at an annual rate
- To date, more than 2,500 loans totaling \$5 million have been disbursed to micro and small enterprises throughout Iraq
- The New Iraq Dinar (NID) has been relatively stable for over four months at around 1,425 - 1,460 NID to the US Dollar
- The Trade Bank of Iraq has issued 254 letters of credit, totaling \$1 billion, covering imports from 36 countries



# *Water and Sanitation*

- **Conducting water and sanitation projects across Iraq that will benefit 14.5 million people**
- **Some 30 - 40 percent of the marshlands deliberately drained by Saddam have been re-flooded since liberation**
- **Completed program in 2003 that cleared over 17,000 kilometers of Iraq's waterways to improve water flow and irrigation**
- **New program in 2004 will clear 20,000 kilometers of Iraq's waterways and employ around 100,000 Iraqis**

**CPA Water Objective: Provide Water Supply, Sewerage & Municipal Services; Improve Water Resource Management; Create viable organization to deliver water / sewerage / municipal services (WSMS); Expand WSMS to meet national needs; Develop full range of municipal services & inclusive delivery mechanism; Infrastructure improvements to water resource system; Facilities improvements & capacity building within Ministry**



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## *Health Care*

- **Estimated that 85% of children have now been immunized and rates will increase with ongoing programs**
  - **Over 5 million children (6 - 12 years) have been immunized for Measles, Mumps, and Rubella**
  - **Over 3 million children under 5 years have been vaccinated since Jun 03**
- **240 Iraqi hospitals and over 1,200 preventive health clinics are operating**
- **Renovated 52 primary healthcare clinics and re-equipping 600 more to provide essential primary healthcare services**
- **USAID continues primary health care training of trainers program which will reach more than 2,000 primary health care providers**

**CPA Health Objective: Improve Quality and Access to Health Care  
Develop health care organizations, management, and infrastructure;  
Train health care professionals; Pharmaceuticals logistic support;  
Secure system; Public health**



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## *Education*

- **Rehabilitated nearly 2,500 schools across Iraq**
  - 4,500 new schools required and 11,939 schools need repairs
  - US Supplemental funds will rehabilitate at least 1,047 schools
  - World Bank may commit to rehabilitate another 1,000 schools
- **Trained 32,000 secondary school teachers and administrative staff**
- **Printed and distributed over 8.7 million textbooks throughout Iraq**
- **Distributed large numbers of school equipment including student desks, teacher desks, chairs, cabinets, chalkboards, and teachers kits**
- **Conducting an accelerated learning program for 600 students to reintegrate them into the school system**
  - Program will be expanded to 50,000 in 2004


**CPA Education Objective: Improve Quality and Access to Education

### Electrical Generation

- Pre-War 4,400 Megawatts (MW) Peak Capacity
- 05 Oct 03 4,417 MW (Met initial goal of 4,400 MW)
- 30 Jun 6,000 MW Peak Generation Capacity  
120,000 MWH Production
- (U) Ambassador Bremer approved an increase plan in Jan to reach 6,000 MW of peak deliverable capacity by 01 Jun. Due to unforeseen problems, these goals slipped until at least 30 Jun
- (U) CPA spring maintenance program continues resulting in about 1,101 MW of generation capacity currently offline for scheduled and 556 MW for unscheduled maintenance




## Crude Oil Production

- Long - Term Target (Dec): 2.8 - 3.0M BPD


